ORDER

- 1. An application was received from Sh.Surya Prakash Gupta through the Office of the Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities stating that he is a homeless disabled person and that his application for grant of pension is not being processed by the concerned authorities of the Social Welfare Department and therefore he requested that his application for grant of pension should be considered favourably.
- 2. The Director Social Welfare Department was requested to file comments and since no comments were received hearings were held. During the course of the hearing the District Social Welfare Officer stated that the application filed by Sh.Surya Prakash Gupta was rejected as his income exceeds the limit for granting the pension. He has an account in State Bank of India Prashat Vihar Branch (Account No.30024458018). A perusal of the statement of the amount deposited in the account indicates heavy receipts and therefore it is not a fit case for grant of pension. Since the petitioner was not satisfied and stated that income indicated relates to his wife the Tehsildar Shahadra Sub Division was directed to file a report regarding income of Sh.Surya Prakash Gupta who reiterated the report already given by the District Social Welfare Officer.

3. In view of the fact that the income of the petitioner is more than the limit for grant of pension to a disabled person it is not possible to support his case which is accordingly disposed of.
